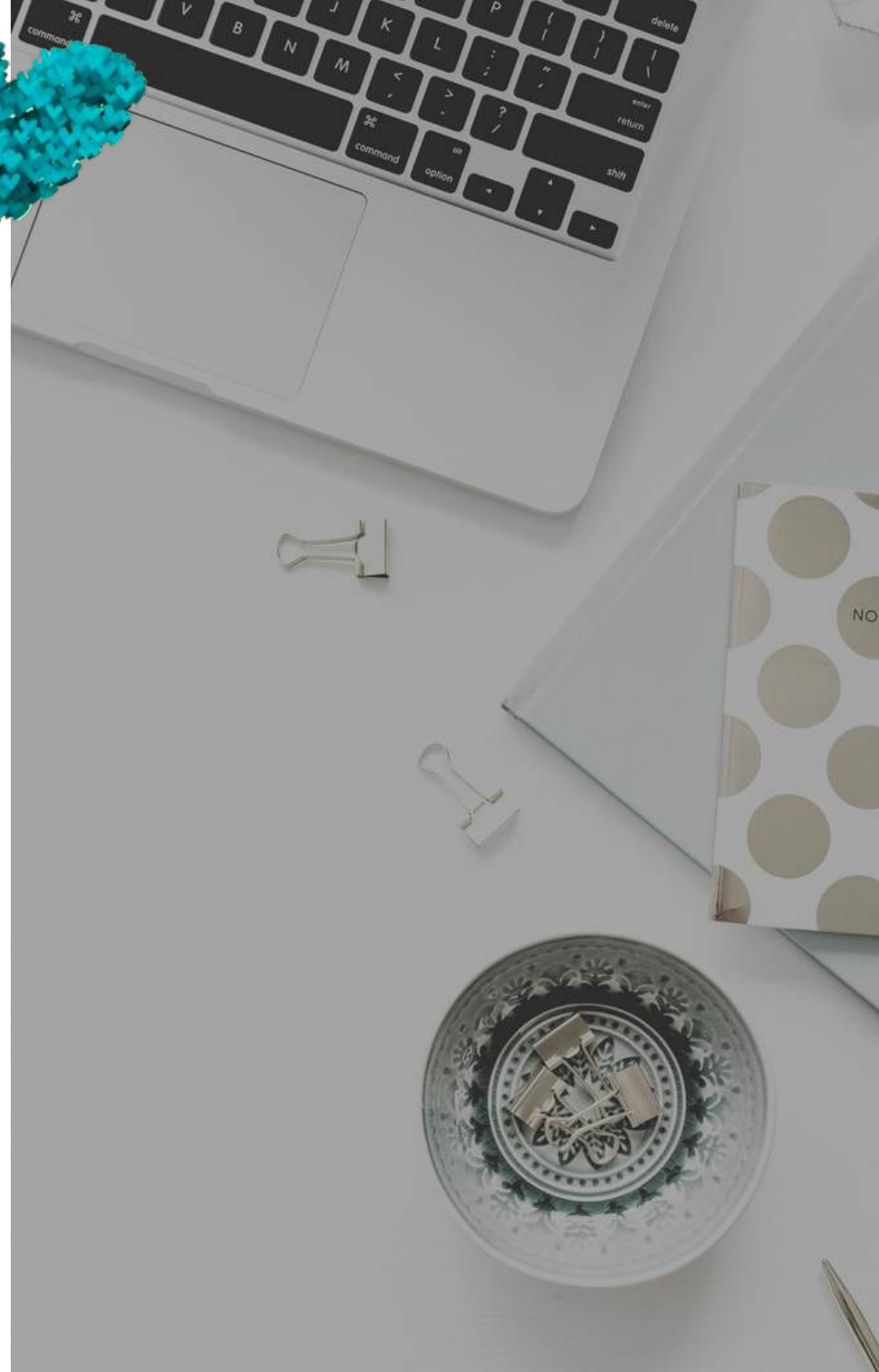
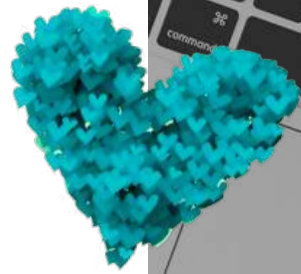




EXPLAINING STATUTORY SICK PAY

AN OVERVIEW

In order to be eligible for Statutory Sick Pay, you need to qualify and have been off work sick for 4 or more days in a row (including non-working days). You are eligible to receive £116.75 per week in Statutory Sick Pay (SSP) if you are too ill to work. This will be paid by your employer for up to 28 weeks. You will need to qualify (see details below) for SSP and have been off work sick for 4 or more days in a row (this includes non-working days).

If you're eligible, you can get £116.75 a week of Statutory Sick Pay (SSP) for up to 28 weeks. You'll be paid SSP for all the days you're off sick that you normally would have worked, except for the first 3.

You cannot receive less than the statutory amount, however, you may receive more if your company has a sick pay scheme, sometimes known as an 'occupational scheme' – to find out read your employment contract.

To qualify for Statutory Sick Pay (SSP) you must:

- be classed as an employee and have done some work for your employer
- earn an average of at least £123 per week
- have been ill for more than 3 days in a row (including non-working days)

Agency workers are entitled to Statutory Sick Pay.

You will not qualify if you:

- > have received the maximum amount of SSP (this is 28 weeks),
- > are getting Statutory Maternity Pay,
- > are self-isolating after entering or returning to the UK and do not need to self-isolate for any other reason.

You can still qualify if you started your job recently and you have not received 8 weeks' pay yet. Ask your employer to find out more.

You're no longer eligible for SSP if you have a continuous series of linked periods that lasts more than 3 years.

Sick notes

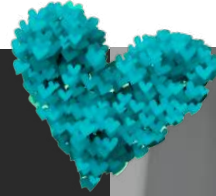
You must only get a doctor's fit note to give to your employer if you have missed more than 7 days of work.

What to do if you don't qualify

In the event of not qualifying for SSP, your employer must give you form SSP1 within 7 days of your illness occurring which you can then use for Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) as a replacement.
